The UW Meat Laboratory helps facilitate the teaching, research and extension activities associated with the UW meat science program. The facility has one full-time manager and employs 8-12 undergraduate students who are trained to complete all daily tasks associated with harvest, fabrication and further processing. The facility harvests between 50-75 head of livestock each year (cattle, sheep, hogs). Product is processed under state inspection and is then sold as a retail offering. The Meat Lab produces summer sausage, snack sticks, and other further processed products marketed by the Cowboy Branded Meats Program.
